GENERAL FILE

PRESIDENT: The motion is to advance LB1. The motion has been seconded. Those in favor of the motion please indicate your pleasure for the advancement of LB1. Clerk will record the vote. The clerk will read the vote.

CLERK: 37 ayes, no nays, 12 not voting, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The bill is advanced. Senator Luedke.

SENATOR LUEDKE: (Microphone not turned on)

PRESIDENT: Clerk will read the title.

CLERK: Read title. LB 2

PRESIDENT: Senator Luedke.

SENATOR LUEDKE: Mr. President, Members of the Legislature, LB2 concerns the bill which was adopted by the Legislature last session for establishing municipal courtrooms for certain cities of the first class. As you recall, the Supreme Court decision held this bill unconstitutional and this amendment merely clarifies Section 7111 which would be inconsistent with that decision and we are just merely setting the record straight on this bill.

PRESIDENT: The chair recognizes Senator Klaver.

SENATOR KLAVER: Senator Luedke, are you taking into consideration what the Supreme Court did or are you ignoring it? Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Is there further discussion? It has been moved and seconded that LB2 be advanced to E & R. Please register your vote. Clerk record the vote. Clerk read the vote.

CLERK: 35 ayes, 2 nays, the remainder not voting Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The bill is advanced.

PRESIDENT: The chair recognizes Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER. Granted, I'm sure conditions are the same today as they have been in the past session. They are the result of the work of the revisors of the statutes in order to correct them to the extent that they now make sense without changing intent of the application of the previous passed law. And somewhere along the line we have to accept the veracity and the judgment of those people who have the responsibility to introduce these
