PRESIDENT: Considering bills on General File. Clerk will read the title of LB35.

CLERK: Read title. LB 35

PRESIDENT: Senator Luedke.

SENATOR LUEDKE: Mr. President, I move that LB35 be advanced to E & R initial. Mr. President, Members of the Legislature, LB35 is a Legislative Council, Executive Board bill which allows the Legislative Clerk to remove some of the old rules which have to be filed with the Legislature every year. They keep piling up and we do not really know which are the current rules and which are the old rules and some of the agencies can take advantage of this by saying, "Well we have the rules on file, just go over there and look at them." They should be brought up-to-date as any law would be brought up-to-date in our session laws and this will allow the Clerk and our Legislature to do that. It is extremely necessary.

PRESIDENT: Is there any further discussion of LB35. The question is shall LB35 be advanced to E & R? Please indicate your vote. We're advancing LB35 to E & R initial. Have you all voted? Clerk will record the vote. Clerk will read the vote.

CLERK: 32 ayes, no nays, 17 not voting.

PRESIDENT: The bill is advanced. LB36, clerk will read the title.

CLERK: Read title. LB 36

PRESIDENT: Senator Luedke.

SENATOR LUEDKE: I move that LB36 be advanced to E & R initial. Mr. President, Members of the Legislature, LB36 covers a multitude of duties of the Clerk's Office of the Legislature in order to expedite the publication of the law by which means we can use the computer in reproducing the laws and setting up the session laws which is something that has always been a great problem. For people who want session laws earlier this will permit the Clerk to set this into motion and will increase the number of statutes that are available from 12 to 15 in the Council's Office and from 1 to 4 in the Clerk's Office. In distribution of volumes of our statutes that we have before us here would be restricted for newly elected senators and thereafter only keeping the volumes up-to-date. As I understand this particular bill it would go into effect now, in other words we've now been issued the full set so it couldn't possibly be effective until the next time that these would be issued. This would save the reissuance of volume statutes every time that we meet. And then it also provides for up-dating these new volumes which is also very necessary.

PRESIDENT: Any other discussion of LB36? Senator Waldo.

SENATOR WALDO: Senator Luedke, I would like to ask you
