PRESIDENT: Senator Holmquist.

SENATOR HOLMQUIST: I'm wondering, then will the state or village have the power to levy the tax or will the Cemetery Board have the power to levy the tax?

SENATOR : No, this is where the city owns it and it would be the trustees of the village or city.

SENATOR HOLMQUIST: The trustees will make the demand on the city.

SENATOR : No, the city trustees and village trustees, they don't have a separate board.

PRESIDENT: Is there further discussion. Chair recognizes Senator Nore.

SENATOR NORE: This has always been kind of a problem up in our community. We have a number of cemeteries around our town who bought their own cemeteries but we give taxes in the town where we live. I've always thought it rather (inaudible) unless we support all the cemeteries in the whole county. This two and a half mills is quite an increase in taxes.

PRESIDENT: Chair recognizes Senator Whitney.

SENATOR WHITNEY: Mr. President, this refers to only second-class cities and villages.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion. Question is shall LB38 be advanced to E & R initial. All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Clerk will record the vote. Clerk will read the vote.

CLERK: 32 ayes, 0 nays, 15 present and not voting, 2 absent and not voting.
