PRESIDENT: Move to consideration of bills on General File.

CLERK: Read title. LB 388

PRESIDENT: Recognize Senator Marvel.

SENATOR MARVEL: I move that LB388 be advanced to E & R for initial. If you'll through all of these figures, you'll find that this is an inter-department transfer of money from one program to another than done by our fiscal staff and consultation with the Department of Education so this is not required additional money. The only pumpkin here is to fund the approximately \$177,000 to fund the reserve teacher account. There was an amendment to the Reserve Teacher Act last session. The amendment went through, there was no money appropriated for the amendment. This in effect clarifies it for the balance of the biennium, in other words for the period of June, well make the reserve teacher fund solvent. That is the only purpose. It should have been solvent and it wasn't. The amendment was put on last session, but no money was put in. It's nothing to do with any pending legislation, it's simply makes solvent the account of the fund with the approval of the department, there's no additional money involved. If there are no questions I renew my motion to advance the bill.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion of the bill. Question is shall LB388 be advanced to E & R initial. All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Clerk will record the vote. Clerk will read the vote.

CLERK: 38 ayes, 0 nays, 11 not voting.

PRESIDENT: The bill is advanced. Move to consideration of LB56. Clerk will read the title.

CLERK: Read title. LB 56

PRESIDENT: Chair recognizes Senator Clark.

SENATOR CLARK: Mr. President, Members of the Legislature, what this bill does is to transfer the authority from the county attorney to the sheriff for protesting a check. I think what it really does is take work off the county attorney, which I'm not sure is right in the first place. But in the second place, there is another bill coming in 427, by Senator Carpenter, which I think is a far superior bill than this bill. I would make a motion that this bill be indefinitely postponed.

PRESIDENT: Question is shall the bill be indefinitely postponed. All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote no. Have you all voted. Clerk will record the vote. Clerk will read the vote.
