PRESIDENT: Move to consideration of LB36. Recognize Senator Holmquist.

SENATOR HOLMQUIST: Mr. President, Members of the Legislature, I think we've discussed this quite a lot and I move for the advancement to E & R initial.

CLERK: There's a motion on the bill, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Read the motion.

PRESIDENT: Chair recognizes Senator Waldo.

SENATOR WALDO: Mr. President, Members, I think we've wasted enough time on this bill, there's an almost an even deviation of opinion. We go from issuing statutes every year, every two years was the amendment defeated yesterday, the amendment I have here this morning would issue a set every four years. I'm not going to take any time for closing, if there is a lot of discussion on this bill this morning I just want to remind you what we're talking about is \$52.56 per set so that the members could have an extra set in their office or home or loan them to a student or put them in a library somewhere. I believe that's enough discussion on the amendment which would give a set to each member each four years, with the turnover we have some of the members, of course, would be getting a set each four years because they're coming in as freshmen senators.

PRESIDENT: Chair recognizes Senator Holmquist.

SENATOR HOLMQUIST: Mr. President, Members of the Legislature I wonder if Senator Waldo would yield to a question or two. What are you going to do about those statutes that are revised. Volumes that would be revised during the four year period.

SENATOR WALDO: I would think that they should be up-to-date but that's a minor problem as far as I see right now.
