PRESIDENT: We're ready for consideration of bills on General File. Senator Carpenter, we were wondering if you're ready to take up LB74.

CLERK: The title has been read Mr. President.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Mr. President, the amendments have been printed in the Journal. The amendments as in the Journal, now become the bill. If you'll notice the fly sheet apparently the League of Municipalities and the people enumerated on the fly sheet are in favor of this bill as amended. What this bill does, is it leaves the allocation, one-third, one-third, one-third as it was in the original bill. It makes a change in the villages and the second-class cities. First one-half is exempted the second one-half you get two for one. The other thing that the bill does, it permits off street public parking when owned and operated by the Municipalities. The last amendment on second-class cities and villages it says the land legally dedicated for street purposes and open and used as filed in the office of the Register of Deeds in each county. So it does allow in the villages and second-class cities a different formula which would be precured of them in order to in the format use what I've just read in the second amendment. I move for the adoption of the amendments.

PRESIDENT: Chair recognizes Senator Elrod.

SENATOR ELROD: Mr. President, Members, Senator Carpenter would you yield to a questions? Is this the amendment that was worked out in conjunction with the League of Municipalities and ...

SENATOR CARPENTER: This is exactly the amendment given to me by Mr. John (inaudible)

PRESIDENT: Senator Carpenter, it's the chairs understanding that something must be done regarding the committee amendments.

SENATOR CARPENTER: We ask unanimous consent to withdraw all the pending amendments. In their place substitute the amendment as in the Journal.

PRESIDENT: That action has been taken.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I ask that all the pending amendments to LB74 be withdrawn and substituted by the amendment which is in the Journal.
