PRESIDENT: Move to the consideration of LB265.

CLERK: Motion on the desk, Mr. President. I ask unanimous consent to take up LB423 on General File.

PRESIDENT: Senator Morgan

SENATOR MORGAN: I would like to ask permission to have this taken up today because of the fiscal impact of this matter.

PRESIDENT: Is there any objection? Senator Simpson

SENATOR SIMPSON: I would like to ask Senator Morgan a question.

PRESIDENT: Senator Morgan, do you yield?

SENATOR SIMPSON: Would you explain a little further what you are talking about with the fiscal impact?

SENATOR MORGAN: This is LB423 and it was advanced from the committee and it provides for the issuance of a single license plate. My reason for wanting it taken up today is that each 30 day period, there's approximately \$45,000.00 spent and I thought if we could get this advanced and it is going to become law, we could save approximately \$40,000.00 in moving this at this time. They are now in the production of '72 license plates and have been for the past 30 days, I believe. This is my reason.

SENATOR SIMPSON: I don't believe I'm going to object, but I would state that I think that we should be careful in taking bills out of line in the proper order. First thing I think that this may be out of order in that the bill should have gone to the Speaker and he should have set the agenda and the necessity for this. He should have set it up, how it should go. I think that this could happen a lot if we are going to overrule our procedures.

PRESIDENT: The chair recognizes Senator Morgan

SENATOR MORGAN: I did go to the Speaker and this is the way he told me to go ahead with it.

PRESIDENT: The chair recognizes Senator Carpenter

SENATOR CARPENTER: I move to amend Senator Morgan's motion. To say that we put in this order these two bills at the head of General File and that 566 shall be first and 423 shall be second, and considered in that order now.

PRESIDENT: Senator Carpenter has asked that an amendment to the Morgan motion. You have heard Senator Carpenter's motion. All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote no.
