PRESIDENT: Are we ready to take up LB654? Clerk will read the title.

CLERK: Read title. LB 654

PRESIDENT: Senator Carpenter, what is your pleasure regarding the amendments?

CLERK: Read amendments.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I move the adoption of the amendments. All this bill does is to request from the Health Department, because there is considerable difficulty in the variation of the standards of the designing and manufacturing of mobile trailers. This only gives the Health Department additional areas of responsibility to determine the frame and supports and things like that. I move for the adoption of the amendments.

PRESIDENT: Motion to adopt the committee amendments. All those in favor say aye, opposed say no. They're adopted.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I move that LB654 be advanced to E & R for initial.

PRESIDENT: Motion to advance LB654. Is there need for further discussion? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Clerk will record the vote. Clerk will read the vote.

CLERK: 26 ayes 0 nays, 23 not voting.

PRESIDENT: The bill is advanced. Senator Luedtke, do you want to handle LB506.

CLERK: Read title. LB 506

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Mr. President, I move the adoption of the committee amendment. Mr. President, Members of the Legislature, the committee amendment merely repeats after page 2, line 27, repeats the same new matter which is in section 1, no presumption shall exist that the mother has...in other words dealing with the fact that both mother and father in a divorce action are considered to be equal as far as the presumptions are concerned when you go into a divorce matter. This has not always been so as far as some cases have been interpreted. This is the idea of the bill.

PRESIDENT: All those in favor of adopting - Senator Barnett did you wish to be recognized?

SENATOR BARNETT: Mr. President, Members of the Legislature, I'd like to ask a question and see if we can't get some feeling. I would like to suggest that we cover the bills for the Senators that are here and present.
