PRESIDENT: Move to the consideration of bills on General File. LB172 will be first. Correction, 152.

CLERK: The title has been read to LB152.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Mr. President, this bill is still in the position of trying to find a reconciliation as to how to accomplish to administer the lending of this money. It is a legal question that hasn't been determined yet as to how far we can go and who can do it within the limitations of the amendments of the Constitution. I move the bill be held over until, well for 10 days.

PRESIDENT: Senator Carpenter has asked to bracket LB152 for 10 days. Are there any objections? Hearing none, so ordered. Move to the consideration of LB236.

CLERK: Read title. LB 236
That is Senator Stahmer's bill, who is not here.

PRESIDENT: We'll bypass it. Next one is LB398.

CLERK: The title has been read. The amendments have been adopted. The motion to advance failed.

PRESIDENT: Senator Stull do you want to take it up at this time.

SENATOR STULL: Mr. President, Members of the Legislature, I failed to get enough votes to advance this bill the other day. There have been two questions asked of me about this. So many Senators have asked why there isn't a provision in here that the junkyards would pay part of this cost of screening. I think the answer to that is the same as if they would want to take some right of way off of my farm. They would have to pay me for the land if I had a fence there, they would have to build a new fence. It's that simple. These people are in business, they're legitimate by being in business and we want to change that, so we're going to have to pay for it. The other question was in regard that perhaps the federal money will not be available so that this can be taken care of in one year, maybe only a hundred thousand of federal money each year. I asked Clarence Meyer, the Attorney General about this and he said that if this bill was passed and he were the head of the highway department, he would have the feeling that he wouldn't be compelled to do only what he could do with the federal money that was coming in by furnishing the one fourth matching money. I think that answers the two questions that people have had. I would again renew my motion to advance LB398 to E & R for initial.

PRESIDENT: Chair recognizes Senator Barnett.
