

START OF BELT 1

SENATOR : Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Senator Snyder.

SENATOR : Senator Snyder and I would like to be excused between one and three. We're going to be at the Omaha Press Club. We have a meeting there.

PRESIDENT: Are there objections? Senator Mahoney, Savage, and Snyder asking to be absent. Are there objections? There are none, so ordered. We have a couple other committee reports.

CLERK: (reading)

PRESIDENT: While the legislature is in session and capable of transacting business, I'm signing LB76, also LB1302.

CLERK: That's all the committee reports Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The chair recognizes Speaker Hasebroock.

SENATOR HASEBROOCK: Mr. President, Members of the Legislature, I move that we suspend the rules and we take up tomorrow's final reading today.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion of the motion? The question is, shall the rules be suspended and the final reading bills for tomorrow taken up today? All those in favor of the motion vote aye. All those opposed vote no. The motion is to suspend the rules, take up final reading for today that is schedule for tomorrow. The chair would observe that we do have a rather varied heavy schedule for tomorrow. The clerk will record the votes.

CLERK: 31 ayes, 0 nays, on the motion Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The motion carries. As soon as we can clear the floor and give the Senators their seats we'll begin with the final reading of LB893. Senator Maresn.

SENATOR MARESH: Mr. President, Members of the Legislature, in the south balcony from my district from Harvard High School we have 34 senior government students and their teachers Verla Prange, Dennis Bryan, Robert Wonka, and Darrell Lupkin. Will they please stand and be recognized?

PRESIDENT: The students from Harvard please rise. We're pleased to have you this morning as spectators to the unique unicameral legislature of Nebraska.
