

START OF BELT 1

PRESIDENT: Are there corrections from the floor? If not, the journal will stand as corrected. We have notices that committee hearings are reported.

CLERK: We have a communication Mr. President from Robert Marlin, chairman of the railway commission (reading)

PRESIDENT: Is there other business on the desk?

CLERK: Committee reports Mr. President, we have examined LB461 and recommend that it be replaced on Select File as amended. LB905A replaced on Select File as amended. 1132 replaced on Select File as amended, 1301 placed on Select File as amended, 1301A Select File as amended, 1220 Select File as amended and 1079A to Select File, 66A to Select File as amended Signed Duke Snyder, chairman.

PRESIDENT: That is all the business on the desk. We can begin to clear and floor and ask the senators to take their seats. We could begin the bills on final readings beginning with 1081.

SENATOR : I move we pass it over until tomorrow.

PRESIDENT: You have heard the motions. Are there objections to the motion? of holding the bill until tomorrow for final reading? Are there any objections? Hearing none, so ordered we will pass over the bill. We will move to final reading of 1487

CLERK: (reading of 1487)

PRESIDENT: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with. The question is, shall the bill pass? All those in favor vote aye. All those opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Once again have you all voted. The clerk will record the vote.

CLERK: Voting aye Senator Barnett, Carstens, Carsten, Chambers, Clark, Craft, DeCamp, Elrod, Epke, Goodrich, Hasebroock, Holmquist, Johnson, Kennedy, Keyes, Kime, Klaver, Kokes, Kremer, Lewis, Luedtke, Mahoney, Maresh, Marvel, Morgan, Moylan, Nore, Orme, Pflister, Proud, Savage, Smith, Skarda, Snyder, Stromer, Swanson, and Wiltse voting aye. Voting nay, Senator Burbach, Stull and Syas. Not voting Senator Carpenter, Duis, Stahmer, Waldo, Waldron, Warner, Witney and Ziebarth. 38 ayes, 3 nays, 8 not voting, Mr. President.
