SENATOR SWANSON: Members of the Legislature, I would like to ask that any resolutions that any of you might have which would call for an interim study be introduced by next Monday. If you have any ideas about any interim study that you want to have conducted during the interim please have them in by March 20th so that the Executive Board can review them and then come back to you with our recommendation.

It shows the General Fund appropriations for operation and capital construction for a ten year period, for the University of Nebraska at Lincoln, the four state colleges as a whole, the University Medical Center and the University at Omaha. Now, I want to explain this just a moment. The University of Nebraska at Lincoln does not include the fieldhouse. This whole thing does not include the student tuition fees nor student tuition and it does not include federal expenses, federal contributions to what we have here. I just thought you would be interested in having some facts before you.
