SENATOR PROUD: Mr. President, in regard to the communication the clerk read about ETV did I understand correctly that that will be printed in the Journal tomorrow and I would like to say that I think the body needs to discuss this and I am giving consideration tomorrow to making a motion that we rescind the action we took before because of the cost and other matters involved.
