(Start of Belt #1)

CHAPLAIN: Prayer.

CLERK: Roll call.

PRESIDENT: Have you all indicated your presence?

CLERK: A quorum present, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. Senator Savage is here. Do we have corrections for the Journal? Are there corrections for the Journal?

CLERK: None, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Excellent. Speaker Proud, did you wish to be recognized?

SENATOR PROUD: Yes, Mr. President, I have an announcement.

PRESIDENT: Proceed.

SENATOR PROUD: On March 28th, I believe it is on a Wednesday, a regional team from the federal government representing different departments, Agricultural Department, etc., is going to be here. It's the Kansas City Region which consists of about nine states. The team on Revenue Sharing, they are going throughout the region explaining the ins and outs of Revenue Sharing. They will meet with the Governor from 10 to 11 A.M. on the 28th. They would like to meet with the Legislature from 11:00 to 11:30, so this will interrupt our schedule. However, this is an extremely important matter so I am suggesting that we recess from 11:00 to 11:30 on March 28th and bring this...let this team come in here and explain the federal government's viewpoint on Revenue Sharing. Are there any objections to that? If not, I'd ask unanimous consent.

PRESIDENT: Senator Proud asking unanimous consent for that interruption. Are there any objections? Hearing none. So ordered. Do we have any notices of Committee Hearings or Reports.

CLERK: We have some communications, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Read the communications.

CLERK: From the Executive Office...read. Another letter from the Executive Office...read. Mr. President, notice of Reference Committee Report...read. Mr. President, your Committee on Enrollment and Review reports...read. Mr. President, your Committee on Retirement Systems...read. Mr. President, your Committee on Enrollment and Review reports...read.

PRESIDENT: While the Legislature is in session and capable of transacting business, I am signing LB 194, and LB 232.

CLERK: That is all, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Now, we have no bills on Final Reading. Are there Resolutions on the desk.

CLERK: None.

PRESIDENT: Senator Barnett, for what purpose do you wish to be recognized?

SENATOR BARNETT: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, I'd like to have your attention for just a minute, please. I'd like to speak on a point of personal privilege.
