

CHAPLAIN: Prayer given.

PRESIDENT: Roll call. Please indicate your presence. Waiting for you to register in.

CLERK: Senator Fowler, asked to be excused Mr. President until he arrives.

PRESIDENT: Are there objections? Hearing none, so ordered. Once again, have you all registered your presence? Clerk will record.

CLERK: Quorum present Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Are there corrections for the journal?

CLERK: Yes Mr. President. (Corrections read)

PRESIDENT: Are there additional corrections from the floor? If not, the journal will stand as correct. The chair recognizes Speaker Hasebroock, former speaker Hasebroock.

SENATOR HASEBROOCK: I'd like to be excuse at 10:00 today.

PRESIDENT: Any objections, to Senator Hasebroock absence at 10:00 today? Hearing none, so ordered. Do we have notices of committee hearings or reports?

CLERK: None, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Well let's see.

CLERK: Mr. President we have a motion, I move we read the bills on the, that were passed over on final reading, signed Senator Carpenter.

PRESIDENT: State the motion again.

CLERK: I move that we read all the bills passed over earlier on final reading.

PRESIDENT: Chair recognizes Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Mr. President, so we understand what the motion is, as I understand it the bills on final reading in the last two columns because they were not in our books, because we met yesterday at 8:00 in the morning, they can't be read until tomorrow legally and technically. The first column which I'm talking about from 77 on down to 506A, are a combination of bills and A bills. I presume this body somewhere along this session and this would be about the day I would think, because we don't have too much else to do, we ought to discuss those things and either vote them up or vote them down and that is the reason for the motion. I don't think it requires a suspension of the rules or anything does it?

CLERK: Not if you can read them all.

PRESIDENT: No, 25 votes will bind the body to that action. Senator Whitney.

SENATOR WHITNEY: Mr. President, May I ask Senator Carpenter a question please?

PRESIDENT: Senator Carpenter will you yield to a question?

SENATOR WHITNEY: Now, Senator Carpenter, this means then that all A bills would be read. Is this your recommendation, is this your motion?

SENATOR CARPENTER: Just those A bills and other bills which are in the first column and that will probably be all that, we have some A bills, and E & R for initial, we can't do
