(Start Belt #1)

PRESIDENT: The Legislature will come to order. We'll have prayer by our Chaplain.

CHAPLAIN: Gave prayer.

PRESIDENT: Roll Call. Please indicate your presence. Will you please indicate your presence. Clerk will record.

CLERK: Quorum present, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: We are properly convened. Are there any corrections for the Journal, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Mr. President, on page 1413, line 40, correct spelling of "difficult".

PRESIDENT: So ordered. Any petitions or memorials?

CLERK: None, Mr. President. None, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Any notice of committee hearings and reports?

CLERK: None.

PRESIDENT: If that's the case, we're ready for Final Reading.

CLERK: Mr. President, I move that we pass over Final Reading with the exception of those motions pending on Final Reading bills. Signed, Senator Carpenter.

PRESIDENT: All right, this is a motion by Senator Carpenter, to pass over Final Reading today with the exception of motions on bills that are on Final Reading. In short, if this is passed, which requires suspension of the rules, we will take motions on Final Reading which I presume for the most part if not entirely are returned to Select File for specific amendments. And after we dispose of those motions, we will not reach Final Reading today. Does everybody understand the motion? And are you ready for the question? Question is, Senator Carpenter's motion which requires a suspension of the rules. All those in favor vote aye. All those opposed, vote no. Requires 30 votes. Clerk will record.

CLERK: 30 ayes, no nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Now, Mr. Clerk, I believe we should take these motions, well do you think we should take them in order of the bills or in the order of the motions that are presented?

CLERK: I can do either one.

PRESIDENT: We will take the motions in the order they've been presented to the Clerk unless there's some objection.

CLERK: Mr. President, the first motion is LB920. I move to return LB920 to Select File for specific amendment. Signed, Senator Luedtke. And then the amendment is....do you want me to read it?

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Yeah, why don't you just read it, then I'll explain it.
