

SPEAKER: The Legislature will come to order. We will have prayer by the Chaplain.

CHAPLAIN: Prayer.

SPEAKER: Roll call, please record your presence. Clerk will record.

CLERK: Quorum present Mr. President.

SPEAKER: Senator Savage.

SENATOR SAVAGE: Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, I would like to have unanimous consent to be excused at 11:00 today to be a pallbearer at a funeral in Omaha.

SPEAKER: So ordered. Any corrections for the Journal Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Read Journal corrections. Read Carpenter adjournment plan motion.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Mr. President, I hope that the membership will pay attention to this. There are a number of Senators who want to adjourn sine die without an intervening period of five days and come back and attempt to override the Governor's Veto if that happens. As I understand the motion, we will adjourn today until Monday. We will come back Monday, Mr. Burnett has guaranteed that if we pass no other bills except those on Select File, and over that way, he will have all the bills completed form by Monday. Then we have to have a lay over of one day. So we could adjourn I would presume Sine Die on Tuesday if we so desired. If in the meantime this is only something to be changed from day to day, when we get back there Monday, if those who want to have the votes to do it then we could stay here and come back in five days in order to give the Governor the chance to exercise his judgment in an attempt to override if that is the position. I would hope that this morning we would not have a long discussion of this. Is Mr. Emory still here?

SPEAKER: Mr. Burnett.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Why don't you go up front. Mr. Emory is back again at my request for you convenience and those that would like to change or say what they would like to do, I hope that we can do it briefly and make up our minds one way or the other then get back to other business. This motion would preclude any consideration of any bill on General File, underlined, not underlined or anything else.

SPEAKER: Let the Chair if you would permit me to just very briefly state what Senator Carpenter said. He visited with me before this. There was considerable amount of criticism just or otherwise, and I'm not way putting myself in a position to talk one way or another on it. I'm just explaining the motion. The motion would be that when we adjourn this afternoon, that we come back Monday and then we can, if we wish meet Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday. There would be no day reserved to override. Now we don't have to meet Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday. I believe that we could just meet Monday and Tuesday if we so desire. That would be 59 days. We do not have
