PRESIDENT: All rise for the morning prayer.

CHAPLAIN: Prayer.

PRESIDENT: Thank you Bishop Flavin. The Legislature will please come to order. Roll call. Record your presence. Record.

CLERK: Quorum present Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Corrections to the Journal.

CLERK: Mr. President, the Journal is without error.

PRESIDENT: Let's hear it for the staff. You mean it's without punctuation error. Mr. & Mrs. Bob Long of North Platte are under the North balcony. They're guests of Senator Rumery. Mr. & Mrs. Long, welcome to the Nebraska Legislature.

Committee reports, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, your Enrolling Clerk reports that she did, on this day at 9 o'clock a.m., present to the Governor for his approval LB 867A, 265, 687, 687A, 867, 761A and 761. Signed, Barbara Jackson, Enrolling Clerk.

Motion on the desk, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Read the motion.

CLERK: I move to suspend Rule 6, Section 6(b) and read those bills set for April 7th today. Signed, Senator Burbach, Speaker.

PRESIDENT: Senator Burbach, Speaker.

SENATOR BURBACH: Mr. President, members of the Legislature. This is the same as we did yesterday. Our rules provide that the bills should be on Final Reading two intervening days. The Constitution provides that one intervening day. So I ask for a suspension of the Rules at this time so we can pass these bills, or not pass them, whatever the desire of the body is, and then present them to the Governor. This will give us an option for overriding his veto's, if there are any, on April the 7th. I move for the suspension of the rules.

PRESIDENT: You've heard the motion. The question is shall Rule 6, Section 6(b) be suspended. Record your vote. Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: 34 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The Rules are suspended for the purpose of Final Reading. Mr. Speaker, we are ready to go on Final Reading are we not? Alright. Would all of you move to your desks as rapidly as possible. We are under ... we are in Final Reading. All Senators are to be at their desks. Nonsenatorial personnel please leave the floor. Commence reading LB 182, Mr..... Senator Lewis, you ask recognition?
