PRESIDENT: All rise for the morning prayer.

CHAPLAIN: Prayer.

PRESIDENT: The Legislature will please come to order.
Record your presence.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Kennedy, Senator Koch and
Senator Marvel asked to be excused until they arrive.

PRESIDENT: Have you recorded your presence. Record Mr.
Clerk.

CLERK: Quorum present, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Are there corrections to the Journal? Do
you have corrections, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Mr. President, a notice of cancellation of committee

reports we have examined and reviewed LB 6 and recommend

PRESIDENT: We move to item 5 of the agenda, Resolutions.
Chair recognizes Senator Bereuter.

SENATOR BEREUTER: Mr. President, members of the Legislature.
You had placed before you yesterday a copy of a resolution
which has been numbered Resolution 2. It relates to mental
retardation. This resolution, which was offered by a number
of Senators, will be open for additional signatures if any
of you would like to also affix your names thereto.

Undoubtedly, all of you have heard about Title 20, the
Title 20 Plan. Basically, what this does is give to the
governors of the various states the ability to set priorities
on the use of federal funds coming from H.E.W. After exten-
sive public hearings in this state, the Title 20 plan was
developed. As one of the results of it some \$2 million
less money is available for the regional community based
mental retardation programs in this state.
