

NOVEMBER 11, 1975

PRESIDENT: All rise for the morning prayer.

CHAPLAIN: Prayer.

PRESIDENT: The Legislature will please be in order. Record your presence. Roll call. Have you all recorded your presence? Record Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Quorum present Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Corrections to the Journal?

CLERK: The Journal Mr. President, is without error.

PRESIDENT: That is what you say. Do you want to put that to a vote Mr. Clerk? Are there corrections from the floor? The Journal shall stand. Any committee reports?

CLERK: None, Mr. President. Mr. President there is an appointment by Senator Savage's committee that yet needs confirmation. Mr. President on page 105 of the Legislative Journal is an appointment submitted by Senator Savage, Chairman of the Committee on Committees of Mr. George Rebensdorf to the appointment of the Board of Trustees of the Nebraska State Colleges. The committee report is set out on page 105 of the Journal.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Savage.

SENATOR SAVAGE: Mr. President, the Committee on Committee's desires to report favorably upon the appointment of Mr. George Rebensdorf of Omaha to the Board of Trustees to the Nebraska State Colleges. The committee suggests that the appointment be confirmed by the Legislative and suggests a record vote. Seven affirmative and none in the negative. I move the adoption of the committee report.

PRESIDENT: Any discussion? Question is the adoption of the Committee Report and the Confirmation of the appointment. Record your vote. Have you voted? Record.

CLERK: 36 ayes, 0 nays, 13 not voting. Vote appears on page 110 of the Legislative Journal.

PRESIDENT: Motion carries.

CLERK: Motion on the desk.

PRESIDENT: Read the motion.

CLERK: Burbach motion to suspend rules. (read)

PRESIDENT: Any discussion? Question is....do you wish to be heard Senator?

SENATOR BURBACH: Mr. President in our rules we talk about one more day, so I am asking for a suspension of the rules. We are constitutionally correct in taking up tomorrows Final Reading bills today. That is all.

PRESIDENT: I believe that you are talking about rule 6, section 16. Can you make that a part of the Journal Mr. Clerk? The question is the suspension of Subsection-C.... The motion is to suspend Subsection B of Section 6 of Rule 6. Record your vote. It requires 33 votes to suspend
