PRESIDENT: All rise for the morning prayer.

CHAPLAIN: Prayer.

PRESIDENT: The Legislature will please come to order. Record your presence.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Frank Lewis asks to be excused until he arrives.

PRESIDENT: Please record your presence. Have you all recorded your presence? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Quorum present, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: I'll try to make myself heard. I don't have much of a voice left. I'm sure that would meet with mixed reaction. Corrections for the Journal please.

CLERK: None, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The Journal shall stand. Are there any corrections from the floor? Journal shall stand. Notices, reports and announcements.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Dworak asks to be excused from 9:30 a.m. until he returns. Senator Carsten would like to be excused this afternoon. Mr. President, I have a report to the Legislature from the Lower Platte South Natural Resources District reporting attorney fees paid and that report will be inserted in full in the Journal. (Report from Lower Platte South Natural Resources District found on page 157 of the Journal). Mr. President, I have returned to my desk from the E and R office LR 147. That resolution is ready for your signature.

PRESIDENT: While the Legislature is in session and capable of transacting business, I do hereby sign LR 147. Do you have anything further, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Nothing further, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Introduction of new bills.

CLERK: I have no new bills on my desk, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Do you have a motion on your desk?

CLERK: Yes, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Read the motion.

CLERK: Senator Kahle yesterday, Mr. President, made a motion to withdraw LR 360. That was read and laid over.

PRESIDENT: Are you prepared, Senator Kahle?

SENATOR KAHLE: I hope so, Mr. President and members of the body. The reason for withdrawing this is because we really don't need it because of the passage of 51st. I guess it's just that simple. There will be no money to divide.

PRESIDENT: It does take 25 votes to withdraw a bill. The

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
