PRESIDENT WHELAN PRESIDING

PRESIDENT: All rise for the morning prayer.

CHAPLAIN: Prayer.

PRESIDENT: The Legislature will come to order. Roll call. Record your presence.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator George asked to be excused until he arrives. Senator Mills asked to be excused until he arrives. Senator Wenditte and Senator Kramer asked to be excused until they arrive. Senator Labedz asked to be excused until she arrives. Senator Reutzel asked to be excused until he arrives. Senator Brennan, Burrows and Fowler ask to be excused until they arrive, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Have you all recorded your presence? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: A quorum present, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Corrections to the Journal?

CLERK: I have none, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Are there corrections from the floor? Seeing none, the Journal shall stand. Notices, reports and announcements.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have pursuant to LR 997 I have lobbyists registrations from January 13th through January 16, 1975. That will be inserted in the Legislative Journal in full. PRESIDENT: New bills.

CLERK: Mr. President, new bills. LR 879. Title read. LB 879. Title read. LB 880. Title read. LB 881. Title read. LB 882. Title read. LB 883. Title Read.

PRESIDENT: We now take up LR 156. The Speaker has ordered that resolutions be limited to one hour of debate. I have just discussed this matter with Senator DeCamp, the principal introducer of LR 156, and he has advised the Chair that the Chair may structure this debate as it chooses. If there are objections from the floor, we will forget the structuring and go back to the rules. It will be the Chair's order then that we will have twenty-five minutes of debate, limited to twenty-five minutes, for the proponents of the resolution. Those of you who wish to speak in support of the resolution please now turn on your recognition buttons, and if there are more than five of you, we will have to decide which one of you get to speak. And then when that is completed, we can take six of you who are opposed to the resolution for five minutes each, and then we will leave five minutes for Senator DeCamp to close.
