PRESIDENT: All rise for the morning prayer.

CHAPLAIN: Prayer.

PRESIDENT: The Legislature will come to order. Roll call. Record your presence.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Moylan would like excused for the balance of the day.

PRESIDENT: Have you all recorded your presence? Make the record.

CLERK: Quorum present, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Corrections to the Journal.

CLERK: I have none, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Are there corrections from the floor? Seeing none, the Journal shall stand. Notices, reports and announcements.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have an Attorney General's opinion addressed to Senator Warner regarding LB 1 and LB 5. That will be inserted in the Legislative Journal in full. Mr. President, a second Attorney General's opinion addressed to Senator DeCamp regarding LB 1 and LB 5. That will be inserted in the Legislative Journal in full. Mr. President, a third Attorney General's opinion addressed to Senator DeCamp relating to questions on LB 1. That also will be inserted in the Legislative Journal in full. Mr. President, I have a Lobbyists registration report for changes reported during the month of June. That will be inserted in the Legislative Journal. Mr. President, Legislative Resolutions 23 and 24 and 25 are ready for your signature.

PRESIDENT: While the Legislature is in session and capable of transacting business I propose to sign and do hereby sign Legislative Resolution 23, 24 and 25.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have a unanimous consent request from Senator Rumery to print some material in the Legislative Journal.

PRESIDENT: No objections? So done. Do you have anything else?

CLERK: No, sir.

PRESIDENT: Final reading. Senator Duis, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR DUIS: An inquiry of the Chair, if I might, sir?

PRESIDENT: Yes, sir.

SENATOR DUIS: We've had read off that there are several Attorney General's opinion and all we hear is that they are going to be printed in the Journal. That won't be done until today, so is there any way possible that we might be able to have the content of those Attorney General's opinions before we take up final reading?
