SPEAKER MARVEL PRESIDING

CHAPLAIN: Prayer offered.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Roll call.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Warner would like to be excused until he arrives, and Senator Labeledz would like to be excused all day today.
