

PRESIDENT MCGINLEY PRESIDING

DR. PALMER: (Prayer offered.)

PRESIDENT: Thank you, Dr. Palmer. Members, please record your presence. Roll call. Members of the Legislature, please come to the Legislative Chamber. A quorum call is underway. Do you want to record the roll, Mr. Clerk?
