

SPEAKER NICHOL PRESIDING

SPEAKER NICHOL: Would you please rise while we have invocation this morning by Dr. Robert Palmer.

DR. ROBERT PALMER: (Prayer offered.)

SPEAKER NICHOL: Thank you, Dr. Palmer. Roll call, please.

CLERK: There is a quorum present, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Thank you. Do we have any corrections to the Journal this morning?

CLERK: Mr. President, LR 3 was offered by Senator Schmit and a number of the members. It is found on page 55 of the Legislative Journal. (Read LR 3.)

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Schmit, please.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President and members, I want to thank the members of this body who have signed the resolution. Almost everyone has signed it. I believe that the only ones who have not signed it did not have the opportunity to do so and I would hope that we will give them the opportunity to put their name on this resolution prior to the time that we close the activities here today. I have drafted this resolution because there is a procedure which must be followed if we are going to name a building and that procedure is specified partially, at least, in the resolution. We are expressing the wishes of the Legislature to the State Building Administrator, who then must go to the Governor and recommend that the building be named after an individual. If that happens and that takes place and the action is favorable, then the Legislature must come back and draft a bill, introduce the bill in the next legislative session, calling for the naming of the building after Senator Marvel.
