PRESIDENT NICHOL PRESIDING

PRESIDENT: (Microphone not activated immediately.) ...George W. Norris Legislative Chamber. We have with us this morning Reverend Cecil Lackore of the United Methodist Conference. Would you please rise for the invocation.
