PRESIDENT NICHOL PRESIDING

PRESIDENT: Good morning, ladies and gentlemen, welcome to the George W. Norris Legislative Chamber. We have with us this morning for our invocation Reverend Leland Klopfer of the Immanuel Lutheran Church in York, Nebraska. Would you please rise for the invocation.

REVEREND KLOPFER: (Prayer offered.)

PRESIDENT: Thank you, Reverend Klopfer. Come back and see us again. Roll call, please.

CLERK: I have a quorum present, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. Do you have any corrections to the Journal today?

CLERK: I have no corrections, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Do you any messages, reports or announcements?

CLERK: Just one item and that is an Attorney General's Opinion addressed to Senator Hefner, and that is all that I have. (Re: LB 421 as found on pages 2224-27 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT: All right we'll move on to legislative resolutions, LR 109, please.

CLERK: Mr. President, 109 was offered by Senators Rod Johnson, Elmer, Schmit Weihing, Miller, Wehrbein, Rogers, Nelson and Moore. It is found on page 2020. It asks the Legislature to recognize researchers in the University of Nebraska Agriculture Research Division for their outstanding contributions to the development of knowledge in agriculture, home economics and natural resources.

PRESIDENT: Senator Rod Johnson, please.

SENATOR R. JOHNSON: Mr. President and members, it is my pleasure and privilege to offer LR 109 which marks the centennial year of the Hatch Act which brought about the ag extension service and the University of Nebraska is carrying out that program and has been very successfully throughout the years. I think it would be important for us today to show our appreciation for the work that they have done, for the research that they have done and also honoring them on this centennial year for the work that they have committed to agriculture in the
