SPEAKER BARRETT PRESIDING

SPEAKER BARRETT: Welcome to this, the Forty-fourth (sic) Day, in the life of this Second Session of the Ninetieth Legislature. Our Chaplain for the day, Reverend Jane Elefson from the First Plymouth Congregational Church in Lincoln. Reverend Elefson.
