PRESIDENT NICHOL PRESIDING

PRESIDENT: Good morning, ladies and gentlemen. Welcome to the George W. Norris Legislative Chamber. Would you please rise for the invocation by Senator John Weihing, please.

SENATOR WEIHING: (Prayer offered.)

PRESIDENT: Thank you, Senator Weihing. Roll call, please.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have a quorum present.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. Do you have any corrections to the Journal today?

CLERK: I have no corrections, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. Any messages, reports or announcements?

CLERK: I have no messages, reports or announcements at this time, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Okay. (Gavel.) Ladies and gentlemen, Senator Scott Moore has a very important message for us. Senator Moore.

SENATOR MOORE: Mr. President, members of the body, I know in this week we have had a variety of announcements and I have an announcement to make. And, no, I'm not moving out of the state, and, no, I'm not resigning. And I'm not running for Mayor of Omaha. But I am getting...I am engaged and getting married. (Applause.) And, if I may, underneath the north balcony, maybe you know my fiancee now, Danene Joy Tushar, an attorney here in Lincoln, and you will all be invited to our wedding in June, hopefully, in York, Nebraska. Thank you very much.

PRESIDENT: Well, we have had about every kind of announcement you can think of so far this session. Senator Vard Johnson. (Gavel.) Senator Vard Johnson, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: I rise for a point of personal privilege.

PRESIDENT: State your point, please.
