PRESIDENT MOUL PRESIDING

PRESIDENT MOUL: Good morning, ladies and gentlemen, and welcome to the George W. Norris Legislative Chamber. Our Chaplain this morning is Pastor Gale Prentice, Retired Presbyterian Minister from Senator Carol Pirsch's District in Omaha. Pastor Prentice.

And I received a report from the Department of Roads, specifically the two maps of the current Nebraska road system. Those will be on file in my office.

PRESIDENT MOUL: While the Legislature is in session and capable of conducting business, I propose to sign and do sign LR 70. We will proceed with General File, Special Order on LB 840.

CLERK: Madam President, LB 840 was a bill originally introduced by Senators Baack and Hartnett. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 29, referred to the Urban Affairs Committee for public hearing. The bill was advanced to General File.
