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order, take each committee and each caucus says we want so-and-so on that committee, that's what happens in the Committee on Committees. And so all I am saying to you is that remember the mechanism because you were involved, and if you felt like you were not involved, then your caucus is the group that prevails as far as the Committee on Committees. The caucus is the one group that brings to the Committee on Committees the names of the people who want to be on each committee, and they present them as we go in the order that is laid out. So at this time, I just want to...I just want you to remember how that happens and who the people are that you are dealing with, it is your caucus, and so I think...I support what Senator Withem said is I think that probably the best thing to do is for the committee to get together once more and go through each committee to be sure that everyone comes out with the committee he or she wants. In the best of all worlds, that will happen, but we know what the world is like and each one of us does not always get what they want. So I won't philosophize any further, I will just ask you to support my motion. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Crosby. Senator Bernard-Stevens.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Thank you, Madam President. Members of the body, the other point that has not been made, I, too, support Senator Crosby, the Chairman, the Chairwoman of the Committee on Committees motion. I hope the body votes to refer it. The thing that I think the body needs to remember is that this does not change any of the process. In fact, it enhances the process. We are going to allow those people that were selected to be the Committee on Committees spokespersons for their caucus to get together as a group and see if any of the changes causes any other subtle changes in the delicate nominal process of putting the committee structure together to be affected, and we need to sit down as a group, which we have not had a chance to do, and do so. I want to point out to the body that once, no matter what happens, whether none of them are agreed to, all of them are agreed to, whatever the possibilities are, that report comes back to this body and it is still open for any amendment that any member wishes to offer. So it is not taking anything out of the discussion. With any luck, the process will work so everything is more smoothly. It comes back and moves on very smoothly. If there are amendments that want to be offered because some member is not satisfied with what happens, that is perfectly within the rules and those amendments
