SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Fisher, does that mean you wish to withdraw your amendment?

SENATOR FISHER: No, I am just saying whatever decision you have made, I will stand with it. I assume, though, that you are not going to honor the switch, did I read that right.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Fisher, you are the primary introducer of the amendment, and if you are not in agreement with it, you can simply withdraw that amendment.

SENATOR FISHER: It was introduced "co." We both introduced it. We both signed that.

SPEAKER BAACK: So are you asking that Senator Pirsch handle this amendment then?

SENATOR FISHER: Well, I guess with the two of us on there, both of us have to do it or one can do it, I am not sure.

SPEAKER BAACK: Well, it is usually the primary introducer that handles an amendment.

SENATOR FISHER: Well, I would just refer it then to Senator Pirsch.
