SENATOR RASMUSSEN: In the State of Nebraska?

SENATOR ROBINSON: Yeah.

SENATOR RASMUSSEN: No. See, the money doesn't go to the schools for the service coordination. It goes to the interagency teams and then they decide how they're going to do service coordination. They might contract with Visiting Nurses Association to do that. They might decide the school will do it. They might decide in Beatrice that the Family Resource Center would do it. It's...so if the schools don't want to have anything to do with the service coordination, they don't have to.

SPEAKER BAACK: One minute.

SENATOR RASMUSSEN: If they want to be involved, they are a member of the team and they can be a part of it.

SENATOR ROBINSON: Thank you. Senator Moore talked about the Medicaid money that we could use in the State of Nebraska. We're down, right now we're down, what, 15 million I've been told and two or three...we got \$15 million? What? It's more than that? Evidently it's more than that, we need to raise more than that. So we have a program here that...another question, Senator Rasmussen.
