

tampers with or alters, through line 5 on page 3, we would then move on down to line 11 on page 3, if the keg identification number has been tampered with, down through reporting. Strike all of Section 5, and then on the last page, on page 5 of Senator Haberman's amendment you would strike part of line 6, where it says, Sections 53-101 through line 8, through respectively. And basically what I'm attempting to do with this amendment to Senator Haberman's amendment is just take out everything that deals with the identification. We're leaving in that you would have to have the...you would have to sign, we're lowering it, as the amendment does, from 20 to 5-gallon kegs. You have to sign for them. You have to give the...your identification, you have to...that has to all be done. You would still have the \$50 deposit on your kegs. So, basically what I'm attempting to do with this amendment is just take out anything that deals with keg identification at this time. As I stated before, until the breweries come in and actually try, or actually put some identification on their kegs, there's just no way you're going to be able to follow them up. Other states have tried it and it hasn't worked. Now, Washington is in this program now where they are attempting to put this on...this one seal on. And it may help, but it isn't going to be the answer, because you can still take it off. The black light was an idea that is working in one state now. But once those kegs there got all full of lights...or all full of these different numbers, you couldn't read it anyway. And this, again, is another way that you...it is not foolproof, because you can always take it off. You can say, well, it just came off. We don't really know, and Senator Haberman says, well, if they want to get the deposit back, it has to be on. And this could come off. These kegs sit in ice and water for days sometimes, so I don't see how we're going to be able to really clamp down, which we need to do some way. But the breweries, we'd have to insist then that the breweries come in and actually put an ID that would be some way stapled into their keg, that it could not be removed. And that isn't...that hasn't happened yet, but that's what needs to happen, if we're really going to clamp down on beer kegs and to keep...to follow them through the entire process. Be glad to answer any questions on my amendment.
