

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See page 1114 of the Legislative Journal.) 23 ayes, 6 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: The amendment fails.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Haberman would move to amend. (Haberman amendment, FA35, appears on page 1114 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR HABERMAN: This...this amendment was to satisfy some of the people who are opposed to the bill. And I instructed...told them that I was going to offer it to see if it could be adopted. The amendment that I handed in eliminates any inference that might be made regarding beer as solely responsible for alcohol related accidents that results in serious injury or death. It removes that language from the bill. I'm agreeing with that. Maybe the mistake was to put it in the first place. I'm trying to please people on this, but evidently you can't please them all, so I move for the adoption of the amendment.

SPEAKER BAACK: Discussion on the amendment by Senator Haberman? Senator Schellpeper.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Thank you, Mr. Speaker and members. Senator Haberman, if I could ask you a question. Are you taking out all of Section 2?

SENATOR HABERMAN: I'm taking out that...what people objected to that states eliminate any inference that might be made regarding beer as solely responsible for alcohol related accidents that result in serious injury or death. That's the only thing I'm taking out

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Well, is that all of Section 2? What lines are you actually taking out in your amendment?

SENATOR HABERMAN: I'm striking all of line 13 through the first period in 14.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: You're striking line 13 through the state in line 14.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Yes.
