CLERK: Madam President, Senator Beutler would move to amend. (The Beutler amendment, FA40, appears on page 1118 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, this amendment also had to do with the management plan. And it seemed to me that if we are going to have a statewide ground water management plan as it related to the contamination of the ground water, that what we ought to do is include fertilizers in the development of that statewide plan, but I can see at this point that there would not be any interest in that amendment either so, Mr. Clerk, or, Madam President, I ask to withdraw the amendment.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The amendment is withdrawn. Next amendment, Mr. Clerk. Items for the record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Madam President, thank you. Very quickly, Judiciary Committee reports LB 779 to General File, LB 114 indefinitely postponed, likewise with LB 269, LB 304, LB 432, LB 483, LB 519, LB 638, LB 716, LB 723, LB 790, LR 2, all reported indefinitely postponed. New A bills, LB 500A by Senator Lindsay appropriates funds to implement 500; LB 349A by Senator Withem appropriates funds to implement 349; and LB 725A by Senator Hartnett appropriates funds to implement 725. PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Elmer.

SENATOR ELMER: Thank you, Madam President. This amendment is very simple. On page 15 of the E & R amendments, line 24 it strikes two words "transportation" and "storage". And that section has delineated the things that the Department of Agriculture are going to write rules and regulations for. Rules and regulations for the transportation and storage of pesticides are very lengthy, already in place and being enforced by a number of agencies, both state and federal. Making additional regulations addressing these particular items within the Department of Agriculture is completely redundant and I would
