

of lawyers. I think we are beginning to try to legislate each regulation that is going to be required under this act and I think we need to concern ourselves with the overall intent of this act, the overall purpose of the act and we need to need to let the regulations and rules be promulgated accordingly and again come back next year if there is something that isn't workable, we'll fix it. But I'm not comfortable without a specific definition of taking out the broad terms transportation and storage. I just don't think it would be wise at this point and I urge the body to go ahead and advance the bill as it is. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator. Senator Beutler. Senator Bromm, did you wish further time?

SENATOR BROMM: Call the question.

PRESIDENT MOUL: There is no one else wishing to speak on the subject? Senator Elmer, do you have closing?

SENATOR ELMER: Yes, Madam President. I would close on this. First of all, it's not my intention to try to make the bill anything less than it should be. It should be a good state FIFRA program regarding the use, the registration, the training of personnel, the certifying of applicators and it's going to be necessary for us to do it. I have opposed this legislation in the past and do not oppose it any longer, but it seems to me that we're going to be reregulating for the nth time these particular two items in the authority granted to the Department of Agriculture and it is redundant, unnecessary and makes the bill more what it really should be, the use and labeling of pesticides and seeing that that is done properly. And I'm sorry that it has become so confusing but that is the basic thing of it. We're doing over and over again in this bill what we're already doing, and I'd ask your support. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Elmer. We'll now vote on the Elmer amendment to LB 588. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 1 aye, 18 nays, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The amendment fails.
