

heart attacks, we don't want to do that. The point is here if, in fact, you want to be effective, this is probably not the way to do it. If you're serious about stopping the problem, then get serious about stopping the problem. Don't stand up here and say this is going to solve the problem. However I do, and Senator Haberman talked to me the other day, and I think he's got me at least partially convinced that this may be a deterrent to some minors who would otherwise go into an establishment. If, in fact, they're not being asked for their license, et cetera, now they have to be asked for this information at least. I suggest to you that most keg beer drank by minors is bought by adults for minors, not by minors themselves, that's been my experience. But if in fact there is some deterrent effect on this, then I would support that. And I, while I don't think this is going to solve the problem, I think this amendment makes 332 a better bill, and accordingly I will support the motion to reconsider.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Hohenstein. Senator Hartnett.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Madam Chairman, members of the body, Senator Haberman mentioned Washington. And I did call the State of Washington and talked to some people out there about the impact of this bill, because it's been in practice out there about four or five years. And there really is no proof that it's changed much at all. My information is a little different than Senator Haberman's. In fact, they've gone more to drinking out of cans and bottles and so forth. And I guess I have an amendment, I'm kind of like Senator Hohenstein, I may support this, but an amendment that simply that we get a ruling or a finding from the Liquor Commission, does it really work, has it...has it done anything. So I have an amendment to the bill to do that. And I...maybe...I think what Senator Haberman is trying is maybe a good effort, but I still have my doubts. I think Senator Hohenstein said it's adults buying for kids that is the problem, and if we can stop that some way. Thank you.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Hartnett. Senator Jones.

SENATOR JONES: Madam Chairman and members of the body, I want to stand to reconsider this motion, too, because I think anything that we can do to deter this will help in the long-run, because we do have the problem out there in my community. So, thank you, I want to reconsider.
