

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Jones. Senator Elmer.

SENATOR ELMER: Thank you, Madam Chair and members. I support this reconsideration motion also. And I feel it's pointed more towards those adults who procure the keg and then let the minors use it. The primary purpose is to identify those people that procure for minors.
