SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Schellpeper. Senator Haberman.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Any other lights, Madam President? This is a close? In closing I would ask that this body, if nothing else, vote on the experience of the State of Washington who had this bill for four years. They say that the labels do not come off, and they say that it's gone a long ways towards stemming keg parties of which we're trying to do. This bill would stop adults, people who are legal, from buying kegggers for minors. It's trying to stop that. Maybe it will work, maybe it won't, I don't know, but we're going to try. Now this little Band-Aid, I hope we don't have to have a big bandage. I hope that this little Band-Aid, as it's been called, does the job, therefore I ask you to support LB 332. Thank you, Madam President.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Haberman. And that was your closing. We will proceed with the vote on Senator Haberman's amendment. Those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote no. We're voting on Senator Haberman's amendment to LB 332. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 1 nay, Madam President, on adoption of Senator Haberman's amendment.

SENATOR CROSBY: The amendment is adopted.

CLERK: Senator, I now have your amendment to amend 332. (Read Haberman amendment, FA35, found in the Journal on page 1114.)

SENATOR HABERMAN: Madam Chairman, members of the body, we have an objection to the words beer appears to be the most popular alcoholic beverage throughout the state. This amendment takes those words out of the bill. The bill says beer appears to be the most popular alcoholic beverage throughout the state, that's been objected to.
