

**SPEAKER BAACK:** Senator Hohenstein.

**SENATOR HOHENSTEIN:** Thank you, Mr. Speaker, members of the body, the only thing that I would add is I think that Senator Chambers left out one adjective and that is that we would very strongly disagree on some of those amendments maybe offered later. The idea behind this, frankly, is that there were some things that we needed to try to resolve on General File and we thought the best way to do this would be to agree to move the bill ahead with the understanding that there would be probably some consideration of maybe two amendments, perhaps others on Select File. One would be an additional attempt to work out some other areas in the bill that really we don't have much objection to. I've had discussions with Senator Chambers and some other members of the body. We would then offer that on Select File and assuming we've worked out some of the concerns and additional concerns with respect to how boot camp will operate and, frankly, how boot camp would be funded, since that is sort of a phantom funding right now, we put the project in but we don't give consideration to how we're going to pay for it. I don't think that is honest legislation and I think we have to address that issue also. What we intend to do is to try to resolve those issues with an amendment that we bring to the body on Select File. And assuming we have enough support on the floor that we'll pass that in and then we'll move to those areas where we may have some controversial issues or some issues that ought to be fully debated on the floor and discussed one by one. There may not be very many of those, but there will be at least two and we wanted to basically not logjam the body on General File. I think it was clear from the, at least the 15 minutes I think of debate that we had on General File that Senator Chambers had some genuine concerns about the language in the bill and we were probably going to logjam this thing to the point of blocking everything else that would go ahead for some time. We didn't want to do that. So I do rise in support of the amendments to the amendments. I will assure the body that we will be bringing back several portions of the bill that were originally included in the committee amendments after we've had a chance to discuss those and try to work out some of the glitches in those, in addition, try to figure out exactly how we're going to pay for, if, in fact, we're going to approve boot camps. I won't stand up here and support boot camps unless we've also got the resolve to pay for the cost involved in that and I do think that Senator Chambers correctly reflects the
