SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay, I guess the reason I bring that up is because it comes back around to something I've thought we should have for a long time and that's some sort of code of ethics and mechanism for dealing with these sort of things, because I think you're at a dead end as far as sanct'ons are concerned, other than the general slap-your-hand kind of thing publicly that we could do. But that would be the same whether we adopted the Landis amendment or retained the original bill.

PRESIDENT MOUL: One minute.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Right?

SENATOR HALL: That's correct.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay, final question. There is a provision in here which I guess was in the original bill also that said that the total amount of expenditures related to every particular member of the Legislature would be made public. And my question is, I understand that with regard to telephone bills, what about staff members, office supplies, things like that, I guess as a...for example, as a committee chair who by duty has a larger number of staff people, uses, I'm sure, a lot more of everything, does this bill require that the Legislature make public and reveal some kind of allocation of total legislative expenses relating to all those different items?

SENATOR HALL: Senator Beutler, we do that through our budget process right now. I mean, our budget is open and it was just heard in front of the Appropriations Committee last week. All that information is available, it's public record.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Time.

SENATOR HALL: Under this bill, it will continue to be public record.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senators.
