

Fund, and then another 27,000 for '94-95 fiscal year, from that same program to carry out the provisions of this bill. So, actually, the cost of the program is far in excess of the 7,000, is that accurate?

SENATOR HABERMAN: The General Fund cost, the tax dollar fund cost is \$7,000, period.

SENATOR HALL: Right, but the overall program is going to be closer to the neighborhood of approximately 27 to really 35,000 by the time it's in full force in '94-95, is that accurate?

SENATOR HABERMAN: That is accurate.

SENATOR HALL: Okay, thank you very much.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Hall. Senator Hohenstein.

SENATOR HOHENSTEIN: Mr. Speaker, members of the body, just a couple of questions. Senator Haberman, again, do you know whether the...the original fiscal note called for General Fund expenditures of \$1,000. Can you tell me why the A bill has changed?

SENATOR HABERMAN: Due to the changes in the bill, as far as change, Senator Hohenstein.

SENATOR HOHENSTEIN: And do those changes in the bill specifically include the amendment that was adopted, which requires the commission to issue the report? Do you know if that's reflected in the fiscal note?

SENATOR HABERMAN: No, but it will be. The commission will include that in the report, or in these...in these funds it will be included.

SENATOR HOHENSTEIN: So that will take care of it? And the Cash Funds, where do they come from?

SENATOR HABERMAN: They come from fees.

SENATOR HOHENSTEIN: So we're basically paying for this out of existing fees, we're not creating any new fees? Okay. And one other question. The...something I guess I didn't catch, it seems to me like we're going to spend about \$20,000 adopting the
