SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Ashford, the way your amendment is drafted, does it tie into any existing statute that you know of which will let us know what community corrections will entail, based on the amendment that you are offering?

SENATOR ASHFORD: No, the amendment solely establishes community corrections in Section 50, and the idea would then be between now and Select File to work out the details of how it would fit into the existing statutes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So if yours were to be attached, your amendment, the concept of community corrections would be, in a sense, on the same footing as the concept of the boot camps that exist in the bill now where details have not been...

SENATOR ASHFORD: Right.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...supplied?

SENATOR ASHFORD: That's right. I didn't want that boot camp section to go forward without the community corrections piece as part of it, and that's why I put it in. As I understand it, that's all that's left of the bill...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Right.

SENATOR ASHFORD: ...at this point.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, thank you. I'd like to ask Senator Abboud a question.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Abboud, would you respond please.

SENATOR ABOUD: Yes, I will.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Abboud, suppose the provisions relative to boot camps would be left intact as they exist now without amendment, would you still be in favor of that language unamended being enacted into law?

SENATOR ABOUD: The bill as it currently stands on...?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Right, the language relative to boot camps, if there were no amendments and that were the language that we
