

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Bromm. Senator Coordsen.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you, Madam President and members of the body. I, too, rise to support the amendment. It takes, I think, away from the ethanol board some hobbles that were on in the language. Now, apparently none of us know the rationale for the original language for the \$30,000, whether that was put in there as a cap in the fear that they would spend all of their money originally for national organization memberships, that is only a guess, I don't know. I do think that this amendment then will allow the ethanol board the flexibility that they should have in determining the amount of money out of their budget that is to be spent on memberships in national organizations, which, I believe, are a vital part of that group. So I think that this would be an improvement on the...for the board and probably should have been done in the original drafting of the bill. Thank you, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Coordsen. Does anyone else wish to speak to this amendment? Seeing none, do you have closing, Senator Lynch? Closing is waived. We will now vote on the Lynch amendment to LB 364. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.
