

SENATOR JONES: I don't see how they could get that much possibly.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Okay, thank you. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Coordsen. Senator Schellpeper, did you wish to discuss the advancement?

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Yes, thank you, Mr. Speaker and members. I had an amendment up there that would have answered most of the questions that have been brought up this morning, but I think rather than take time with the bill at this time, because I think it is a bill that is not needed. I don't think that Howard County really wants to join, if you will look at the majority of the cattlemen in that county. And so I would just urge the body to oppose the advancement at this time until we can come in and work out a compromise with the sponsors of the bill. I think we could do that if they are willing, like they stated they would on General File, that they would accept an amendment that would put it back to local people, and if they will accept that, I think right now, we need to just not support the advancement of the bill, and then we will work out an amendment and it will be back then later on. So at this time, I would urge the body to oppose the advancement this morning. Thank you.

SPEAKER BAACK: Anyone else wishing to speak to the advancement? Seeing no one, you've heard the motion to advance LB 246. All those in favor say aye. Opposed no. It is advanced. Yes, we will pass over 629 and go to LB 346.
