

case basis or develop some sort of criteria on their own to do that. Frankly, that's, I believe, the language in some of the statutes now on exemptions so they can do that. They have done it. They do it on the penalties and I think that's the language that is used in the statutes now. So I would urge the body to adopt my amendment and then the Warner amendment and move 346 ahead.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Hohenstein. We will now vote on the Hohenstein amendment to the Warner amendment. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted on the Hohenstein amendment? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 6 nays, Madam President, on the adoption of Senator Hohenstein's amendment.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The amendment is adopted. We will return to debate on the Warner amendment. Does anyone wish to address the amendment? Seeing none, do you have closing, Senator Warner? Closing is waived. We will now vote on the Warner amendment to LB 346. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted on the Warner amendment? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 4 nays, Madam President, on adoption of Senator Warner's amendment.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The amendment is adopted.
