When this leads into some of Senator Hall's amendments, that's when I get concerned.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Moore. Does anyone else wish to speak to this amendment? Seeing none, do you have closing? Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: Yes, Madam President, I understand the concern Senator Moore has got. This is an amendment for our good friend Doc Winger of the Public Service Commission who tells me that if we don't get it through and there is some doubt that if we wait for the other bill that we might get to it. If we don't get it through, we've got a problem with the way we administer these devices and regulate them and the FCC would take over and we've got a problem, so it's important we pass the bill. There is no opposition to it that we know of. It did come out of committee and is on our consent calendar, but does have an amendment and so there is some question whether we'd ever see it come to the floor. So I would ask your indulgence and allow us to amend this bill and allow us to further regulate dialing devices. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Wesely. We will now vote on the Wesely amendment to LB 305. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.
