SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Bromm. Any further discussion on the Beutler amendment? Seeing none, Senator Beutler, would you like to close?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Crosby, members of the Legislature, the amendment has been passed out to you. The amendment, I might say, fails to note that I strike the Bernard-Stevens amendment. The amendment that's filed with the Clerk does that also. So we strike the Bernard-Stevens amendment and we put in place a permit system, one of the advantages of which gives everybody who is affected by a transfer an opportunity to comment on it. Another major advantage of which is that it treats all commercial users the same. It doesn't deal with agricultural users at all, it deals with commercial users as has traditionally been defined in the statutes so that one little commercial user is treated the same as another and a special privilege is not given to the narrow category of golf courses. They say the process is too expensive, but think about this a minute. Think about this a minute. The people who are bringing this bill to you today didn't think it was too expensive to go through the process, they tried to go through the process. It wasn't that they didn't like the process, it's that they couldn't access the process. Now they can access the process but it just doesn't work fast enough for them. So they want to change the way we do everything, the way we look at the whole world so they can do something a little bit faster. You really shouldn't let the tail wag the dog like this. You really shouldn't let the tail wag the dog. So if the process wasn't too expensive in the first place, why would it be too expensive now? I don't think the expense of the process is what they're concerned about. So, with that, Senator Crosby, I would ask for the adoption of the amendment.

SENATOR CROSBY: Yes, Senator Beutler, I couldn't quite hear what you said there at the end. I'm sorry.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Yeah, the Judiciary Committee is out so I would ask for a call of the house and a roll call vote.

SENATOR CROSBY: So you're asking for a call of the house. Thank you. There is a request for a call of the house. All in favor vote aye, those opposed no. Record, Mr. Clerk.
